Exemptions to Disclosure	 Exempted records include: Records the disclosure of which presents potential security risks, or danger to public safety or welfare Pending criminal investigations Sensitive personnel records [e.g. personnel records with identifying information [§ 41-13-7] Registration and circulation records in college and university libraries Not just public safety but also "records the disclosure of which would otherwise be detrimental to the best interests of the public." § 36-12-40.
Access Rights	 Burden and expense of copying the writings and taking the copies must be borne by the citizen or his or her agent as provided by law or as required by such reasonable safeguards as the custodian may impose Policy in favor of access Every citizen
